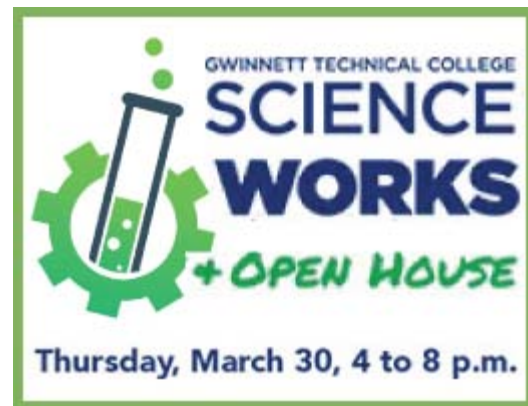

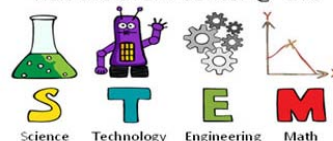
Georgia Cares

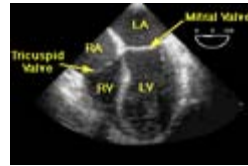
